SAVE THE DATE—ANNUAL MEETING ON APRIL 27,

The Champaign County Chapter annual meeting and dinner will be held Sunday April 27. UI Chancellor Nancy Cantor has agreed to be our featured speaker.

One of the functions of the annual meeting is to elect officers and select members who will serve on the Steering Committee. If you or someone you know would be interested in serving, contact an existing Steering Committee member. Names of suggested members will be given to the nominations committee in January, which will recommend a slate to the membership at the annual meeting.

Serving on the Steering Committee is a great way to make sure your civil liberties concerns are addressed at monthly meetings. Committee members also have opportunities to organize educational or activist events and to serve on other community panels as a local representative of the ACLU. We strive to have representation on the Steering Committee from all segments of our community, so no particular qualifications are necessary other than a commitment to the ideals of the ACLU.

Chapter Update

One of the main projects this year will be to organize a high school essay contest for area schools, a long-time goal of the Chapter which is finally within reach. Spearheading this effort is Cecile Steinberg, who will be working with Deb Rugg and Barbara Wisocki. Local law firms and the News-Gazette have also expressed interest in helping. The theme will focus on defending specific constitutional rights—stay tuned to local media for details.

The Chapter continues to be involved on community boards and panels. Stan Levy is on the Champaign Police Department Advisory Board and provides the Steering Committee with regular updates on evolving policy and procedure.

Stephen Portnoy has been our representative on the Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Policy Board, but the board is disbanding for the time being due to lack of funding.

While not officially Chapter activities, Steering Committee members Stan Levy and Stuart Laird are active advocates for CASA, Court Appointed Special Advocates. The Chapter heartily supports their efforts in helping to protect the interests of minors in difficult situations.

We were a co-sponsor for a candidate's forum September 30th focusing on child welfare, providing input for questions to the candidates.

Susan Cohen is helping to organize a program at the UI entitled "Increased

Security and the Law of Unintended Consequences".

The *Crue* case involving prior restraint of free speech at the UI has received favorable judgments at every phase. The University has appealed the latest action concerning the award of legal costs.

The Steering Committee recently invited Clarence Shelley, former dean of students and associate vice chancellor at UIUC, to join the committee. Integral in advancing opportunities for African-American students at the UI for more than 30 years, Clarence will bring vital knowledge and experience to the Chapter.

The campus chapters have representatives on the Steering Committee who have been active as well—see page 4 for their updates. The Chapter provided financial support for speaker expenses for the death penalty forum in the spring and for a *Daily Illini* ad which presented a "know your rights" summary customized specifically for resident aliens.

CAMPUS ACLU ACTIVITIES IN FULL SWING

The Champaign County Chapter is fortunate to have two active student groups—the UIUC Student Chapter and the College of Law Chapter.

The Student Chapter held a Community forum on the death penalty October 2 with speakers from the Illinois Coalition Against the Death Penalty. They are also sponsoring speaker Jello Biafra October 16, whose band the Dead Kennedys' *Frankenchrist* album was the subject of a 1987 court battle over artistic expression. He is currently active in the Green Party and continues challenging conventional wisdom as a spoken-word artist.

Plans for the year include a candidate forum, a benefit concert, and a discussion of post-911 civil liber-

ties challenges featuring a video of legal experts who spoke at a demonstration on the quad earlier in the year. They also hope to bring a speaker from NORML (the National Organization for Reform of Marijuana Laws).

The College of Law Chapter held their first general meeting September 14, a cookout at a private home attracting more than 40 law students.

Their main project this year is to organize much needed "street law" classes. These classes, geared toward high school and college students, aim to help avoid unnecessary arrests by educating young people on how to safeguard their rights in a calm and confident manner when approached by police on

Both campus chapters are making a special effort to reach out to international students this year. The County Chapter closely followed the case of former UI student and political activist Ahmed Bensouda, who was arrested in Urbana last June on immigration charges and spent several weeks in custody before being allowed to leave the country. While we had made contact with ACLU-IL regarding the case, it was resolved relatively quickly due in part to great public response from friends and support from attorneys hired by family.
